**PRACTICAL OPTIC** - "Any rifle with optic sights, with no restriction on slings or rests. If any rest is utilised it must remain fitted to the rifle at all times during the match".

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**SATURDAY MORNING 13<sup>th</sup> March 2010**

**START TIME 08.30**

**Assemble at the 300-yard car park on the RHS of Century Range.**

**PRACTICAL RIFLE SHORT RANGE MATCH**  
**(The Methuen & Army Hundred Cup – ARA Match 8)**  
**(MATCH CONDITIONS AND TIMINGS AS FOR THE METHUEN)**

**Practice 1 (Harassing Fire)**

- Distance: 300 yards.
- Position: Prone
- No. of shots: Two sighting shots and ten to count.
- Target : DP 1.
- Scoring: 5 and 4.
- Timing: One timed exposure of 60 seconds.
- Procedure:

1. After the two sighting shots have been fired and signalled, firers will be ordered to apply safety catches, stand up and adopt the standing alert position.
2. On the appearance of the targets for 60 seconds, they will adopt the prone unsupported position and fire ten rounds.
3. Scores will be communicated to the firing point and spotting discs shown for 25 seconds.

**Practice 2 (Fire & Movement)**

- Distance: 300 to 100 yards.
- Position: At 300 yards  
At 200 yards sitting, kneeling or squatting.  
At 100 yards standing.
- No. of shots: Ten to count.
- Targets: DP 2.
- Scoring: 5 and 4.
- Timing: One exposure of 15 sec at 300 yards.  
15 sec later there will be a 1 sec exposure followed 30 sec later by 2 exposures of 6 sec with a 10 sec interval at 200 yards.  
15 sec later there will be a 1 sec exposure followed 30 sec later by 2 exposures of 6 sec with a 10 sec interval at 100 yards.
- Procedure:
  1. At 300 yards firers are to be in the standing alert position, rifles loaded with ten rounds and safety catches applied.
  2. When the targets appear, firers are to adopt the prone position, make ready and fire two rounds.
  3. After firing the second round bolts are not to be operated.
  4. On each subsequent appearance of the targets, firers are to advance to the next firing point and fire two rounds at each appearance of the target. Positions for firing will be as above.
  5. Firers may not change their position until they are required to advance to the next firing point.
  6. **During all movement safety catches are to be applied with an empty case in the chamber.**
  7. Spotting discs will be shown and scores communicated from the butts.

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### **Practice 3 (Close Quarter Snap)**

- Distance: 100 yards.
- Position: Standing, then kneeling or squatting.
- No. of shots: Ten to count.
- Target : DP 2.
- Scoring: 5 and 4.
- Timing: Five double exposures of three seconds up, two seconds down, and three seconds up at irregular intervals over a period of two minutes.
- Procedure:
  1. Competitors are to be in the standing alert position with rifles loaded, made ready and safety catches applied.
  2. The first shot in each double exposure is to be fired from the standing position and the second from the kneeling or squatting position. Competitors are to return to the standing alert position after each double exposure.
  3. Only two shots may be fired at each double exposure.
  4. Spotting discs will be shown and scores communicated from the butts.

### **Practice 4 (Rapid)**

- Distance: 200 yards.
- Position: Sitting, kneeling or squatting.
- No. of shots: Ten to count.
- Targets: Two DP1.
- Scoring: 5 and 4.
- Timing: 25 seconds.
- Procedure:
  1. Competitors are to be in the standing alert position with rifles loaded, made ready and safety catches applied.
  2. On the appearance of the targets the competitors are to adopt the sitting, kneeling or squatting position and open fire. Not more than 5 hits are to count on each target.
  3. Spotting discs will be shown and scores communicated from the butts.

### **Practice 5 (Snap)**

- Distance: 300 yards.
- Position: Prone
- No. of shots: Ten to count.
- Target : DP 1.
- Timing: Ten exposures of three seconds with irregular intervals over a period of five minutes.
- Scoring: 5 and 4.
- Procedure:
  1. On completion of sighting shots rifles will be made ready with ten rounds and the firer will adopt the prone unsupported position.
  2. Targets will be exposed randomly over a frontage of six feet.
  3. Only one shot may be fired at each exposure.
  4. Spotting discs will be shown and scores communicated from the butts.

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**SATURDAY AFTERNOON**

**MATCH R1304 -NATIONAL GUARD INFANTRY INDIVIDUAL MATCH**

64 Rounds per firer, 2 x DP1 at each distance, the number of shots at each distance is based on the competitors individual fire control plan. All ammunition and magazines must be carried by the competitor for all Practices.

**Practice 1- Rapid Fire 400 yards Prone**

- Type of Practice – Rapid
- Distance – 400 yards
- Position – Prone Unsupported
- Rounds – 4 sighting shots, round count as per firers fire control plan
- Target – 2x DP1
- Scoring – 5 Points per hit. Any target with 6 or more hits will receive an additional 25 point bonus.
- Timing – 1 minute non-firing preparation period followed by 1 exposure of 50 seconds.
- Procedure
  1. Competitors start in the prone position.
  2. Competitors have a 60 seconds non-firing preparation period in which to make ready followed by 1 exposure of 50 seconds.
  3. On appearance of the targets the competitor will engage them with a number of rounds to be decided by the competitor.
  4. After firing, the competitors have a 60 second period in which to **make safe** ready for the next practice. i.e. Magazine inserted & safety applied with an EMPTY chamber. During this time scores will be recorded, but spotters will NOT be shown.

**Practice 2-Rapid Fire 300 yards Prone**

- Type of Practice – Rapid
- Distance – 300 yards
- Position – Prone Unsupported
- Rounds – Round count as per firers fire control plan
- Target – 2x DP1
- Scoring – 4 Points per hit. Any target with 6 or more hits will receive an additional 15 point bonus.
- Timing – 45 seconds to move from 400 to 300 yards followed by 1 exposure of 50 seconds.
- Procedure
  1. Competitors start in the prone position.
  2. On exposure of the targets for a 1 second flash, the competitors will have 45 seconds to move to the 300 yard firing point and adopt the prone position. The targets will then appear for one 50 second exposure, during which the competitor will engage the targets with a number of rounds to be decided by the competitor.
  3. The rifle must not be loaded until the competitor is in the prone position at the firing point.
  4. After firing, the competitors have a 60 second period in which to **make safe** ready for the next practice. i.e. Magazine inserted & safety applied with an EMPTY chamber. During this time scores will be recorded, but spotters will NOT be shown.

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### **Practice 3-Rapid Fire 200 yards Kneeling**

- Type of Practice – Rapid
- Distance – 200 yards
- Position – Kneeling
- Rounds – Round count as per firers fire control plan
- Target – 2x DP1
- Scoring – 3 Points per hit. Any target with 6 or more hits will receive an additional 10 point bonus.
- Timing – 45 seconds to move from 300 to 200 yards followed by 1 exposure of 50 seconds.
- Procedure
  1. Competitors start in the prone position.
  2. On exposure of the targets for a 1 second flash, the competitors will have 45 seconds to move to the 200 yard firing point and adopt the kneeling position. The targets will then appear for one 50 second exposure, during which the competitor will engage the targets with a number of rounds to be decided by the competitor.
  3. The rifle must not be loaded until the competitor is in the kneeling position at the firing point.
  4. After firing, the competitors have a 60 second period in which to **make safe** ready for the next practice. i.e. Magazine inserted & safety applied with an EMPTY chamber. During this time scores will be recorded, but spotters will NOT be shown.

### **Practice 4-Rapid Fire 100 yards Standing**

- Type of Practice – Rapid
- Distance – 100 yards
- Position – Standing
- Rounds – Round count as per firers fire control plan
- Target – 2x DP1
- Scoring – 2 Points per hit. Any target with 6 or more hits will receive an additional 10 point bonus.
- Timing – 45 seconds to move from 200 to 100 yards followed by 1 exposure of 50 seconds.
- Procedure
  1. Competitors start in the kneeling position.
  2. On exposure of the targets for a 1 second flash, the competitors will have 45 seconds to move to the 100 yard firing point and adopt the standing position. The targets will then appear for one 50 second exposure, during which the competitor will engage the targets with a number of rounds to be decided by the competitor.
  3. The rifle must not be loaded until the competitor is in the standing position at the firing point.
  4. After firing, all rifles will be cleared on the firing point. Scores will then be recorded, but spotters will NOT be shown. Do not leave the firing point until told to do so.
